Biography

During his thirty year career with the Federal government, Mark Pollitt served as military officer in the United States Marine Corps and United States Coast Guard as well as an FBI Special Agent. During his FBI career he investigated organized crime, narcotics, stolen property, white collar fraud and computer crime cases. He was the first Agent designated by the FBI Laboratory as a Computer Evidence Examiner in the newly formed Computer Analysis Response Team. In 1996, he was promoted to FBI Headquarters where he led the CART program during the period in which it grew from a handful of people to over 250 Examiners and became the preeminent computer forensic unit in the world. In 2002, he became the Director of the FBI's Regional Computer Forensic Laboratory Program where he worked with Federal, state and local law enforcement agencies to build digital forensic laboratories throughout the United States. Mr. Pollitt served as the Chairman of both the International Organization on Computer Evidence (IOCE) and the Scientific Working Group on Digital Evidence (SWGDE). He currently serves as the Co-Chair of the Digital Forensic Educator's Working Group and is Vice-Chair of IFIP WG 11.9. From his retirement in 2003 until the fall of 2006 he split his time between teaching and consulting. In August of 2006, he joined the faculty of the Engineering Technology Department, College of Engineering and Computer Science, University of Central Florida and the National Center for Forensic Science.
